
OUR HISTORY

Achievement Preparatory Academy Public Charter Schools (Achievement Prep) began operation in 2008 under authorization from the DC Public Charter School Board (PCSB). Achievement Prep currently operates and manages two high-quality charter schools, which serve scholars in grades K through eight based on proven instructional strategies, exceptional personnel, and deep community relationships. Achievement Prep has consistently received a Tier 1 performance rating as determined by the PCSB.

Our Approach

1. More time on task.

The academic year at Achievement Prep is approx. 10 days longer and the school day is approx. 2 hours longer than at a typical school, resulting in an extra two years of education.

2. Maximize the time we have with our scholars.

We work as a team to create a sense of urgency easily noticeable to any visitor. Since our scholars come to us 2-3 grade levels behind, we believe that every minute we have with them counts.

3. Read, baby read!

We have built a school-wide culture of reading into the school day with double blocks of literacy and time for scholars to Drop Everything and Read (DEAR). By 8th grade, all scholars are reading complex novels.

4. No excuses.

All lessons at Achievement Prep are rigorous and fast-paced. Our teacher teams create weekly "Show What You Know" quizzes that assess scholar understanding and provide the data they need to adapt their instruction.

5. Focus on building strong character.

Our character education system shows scholars that good deeds and hard work pay off. week, scholars are able to earn DREAM dollars for positive behaviors and each week, scholars receive their own paychecks.



Achievement Prep has virtually closed the achievement gap in math between African American and white students.








OUR RESULTS


OUR COMMUNITY

Achievement Prep's founders made an intentional decision to make **East of the River** our home. Our campuses are **neighborhood schools** and we take great pride in being one of Ward 8's treasures. Our focus is on positively impacting the neighborhoods in which our scholars and their families live and bringing vibrancy back to a part of the city that has such a rich cultural history.

WARD 8 AS HOME

Almost 100% of our scholars identify as Black/African-American. And the majority of our scholars are eligible for free and reduced meals and live in an economically disadvantaged section of our nation's capital.
